Timely compliance by the water system with all Drinking Water Statutes and Regulations, including Orders or other requirements (permit conditions, sampling, and inspections) is considered to be essential activities.

During a Power Shutoff

A water system depressurization can occur when a disruption, such as a power outage, causes a loss of continuous positive pressure that falls below 5 psi. A system depressurization can lead to health risks associated with drinking water contamination.
