GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY HAPPENING TODAY FOR NORTH COUNTY CORRIDOR PHASE 1

Regional partners mark milestone in long-awaited safety and mobility project.

Modesto, Calif. – Stanislaus County and its regional partners will gather for the groundbreaking ceremony of Phase 1 of the North County Corridor (NCC) project on Tuesday, July 9, 2025, at 9:30 a.m. The event will take place at 3634 Claribel Road in Modesto, just east of Claus Road. Limited onsite parking will be available. The North County Corridor is a long-anticipated expressway project designed to improve regional mobility, reduce congestion, enhance safety, and support economic growth across northern Stanislaus County.

Phase 1 will construct a new 2.5-mile expressway segment between Oakdale Road and Claus Road, featuring:

- A grade-separated interchange at Roselle Avenue
- A new bridge over the MID Lateral No. 2 Canal
- Intersection and frontage road improvements

“This is a transformative project that’s been decades in the making,” said Buck Condit, Chair of the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors. “Breaking ground on Phase 1 marks a major milestone in improving safety, connecting communities, and supporting the future of this region.”

The North County Corridor is a collaborative effort between Stanislaus County; the cities of Modesto, Riverbank, and Oakdale; the Stanislaus Council of Governments (StanCOG); and Caltrans. Once completed, the 18-mile expressway will connect SR 108/McHenry Avenue in Modesto to SR 120 east of Oakdale, serving as a critical east-west corridor for residents, commuters, and goods movement.
