Α.	CALL TO ORDER & INTRODUCTIONS	Actions
	The meeting was called to order and those in attendance introduced themselves. Veronica Plaugher was welcomed to the Commission as she introduced herself as a new Park Commissioner. She is a health educator with Stanislaus County Health Services Agency and was born and raised in Patterson for twenty-six years. She feels passionate about contributing to her community. C.	APPROVAL OF MINUTES	Actions
	Minutes for the May 12, 2016 meeting were approved upon motion and second with the following additions: the Commission discussed and asked for clarification of what worked and what did not at the boating event at Woodward Reservoir; a note is to be added to the minutes that Chairman Keller came in after roll call was made by Ron West; there was a discussion regarding the renaming of the Empire pool and amending the dog park ordinance. The Commission wants to ensure these moves forward without delay.	Kennedy, West, unanimous approval
D.	STAFF REPORT	ACTIONS & REPORTER
1.	The July 4 <sup>th</sup> fireworks show is ready for kick off on the actual day with syncing music, from the radio station, so tune in. Thirty-thousand are expected to show for this event. Concessions are available based on those who apply to be present on this particular weekend. Food Vendors would need to work with Environmental Health.	Cathy Gomez/Jami Aggers
2.	An incident involving two persons drowning was reported on Memorial Day weekend. Life jacket stations are open on the weekends. Memorial weekend was the first weekend the station opened for the season. A concern was brought up about whether additional steps could have been taken to prevent such incidents. Mr. Persike asked about what happened and if there is anything that could be put into place to prevent such an unfortunate tragedy. The Sheriff's Office immediately takes over when incidents like this occur. Information is relayed to the Parks Department, although the actual circumstances remain unclear, it was understood the victims were on a boat and had jumped into the water for a swim. The boat owners were not parents of the children who were involved in the	Ed Persike

drowning. Three kids were swimming together; as one child became in distress, an immediate attempt was made to extract the child. Two kids were said to have	
gone under water and did not come back up. The Commission raised a concern about understanding the cause to better understand ways to help prevent such incidents, e.g. education, water levels. The discussion was focused on preventative measures. Suggestions of mandated life jackets were made with enforcement aspects to be explored. Commissioner Ron West also noted that th County does have swim lessons available.	
3. Modesto Reservoir held some archery events. La Grange OHV Park will be holding an <i>Outlaw Fest</i> event on June 25 and on July 6, 2016. The group also had an earlier <i>Outlaw Fest</i> on May 21 <sup>st</sup> . PAL has been running the pool successfully this summer. Community neighborhood parks are being utilized for various events. Some water restoration has been issued for neighborhood parks The Frank Raines generator project is in progress and moving along. Both OHV park grants have been awarded totaling \$564,178. The Fairview housing grant is still in progress until the end of June. The requested amount was for approximately \$400,000. The desirable restroom installations was included as part of this fund.	
4. A question was asked if the County collaborates on the cost of the wall damage a Countrystone Park. Due to the frequent wall damage reports, staff may be working on this detail already, however, the Department will be sure to look at thi option.	
OTHER BUSINESS	ACTIONS & REPORTER
1. Woodward held its First Annual Spring Boat Expo, which was a great event. The Department shared what worked and what didn't work from the first annual boat show event. The event went smoothly. The boats were beautiful and the boat demo went well. The Department integrated photos into the event along with Mother's Day celebration. Fun entertainment activities such as a train ride, food, and a clown with balloons were provided. Cross promotions of upcoming events Two radio stations helped promote the event. Traffic was controlled by explorers Four or five boat vendors were present. Three boats were sold. Vendors were excited about the event and were interested in returning for the next annual even Next year's anticipated date would be sometime in June. The weather, as it turned out, was rainy which may have affected the attendance. There were approximately two thousand attendees this year. Ideas for planning the next eve are being considered.	t.
2. A brief discussion was held about liability insurance. It was suggested the Count carefully assess the risks and review the actual needs so that it does not inhibit the process. The Department does evaluate and consider post-event improvements as they are identified.	у
3. Commissioner Keller would like to keep the pool renaming and dog park items as standing line items on the agenda under "Other Business". The Department's current master plan does not include a dog park plan. An update of the plan is on the radar but there is no scheduled date to work on the master plan as of yet. The ordinance change can still move forward prior to the plan, however, this may not necessarily tie in a project plan for a dog park. The Department has plans to include dog park options in the new master plan. The Commissioner would like to move forward on the ordinance change.	Jami Aggers
