## C. HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION INITIATIVE

 Jeanette Fabela, Housing & Supportive Services Manager provided a presentation to the Commission on the Focus on Prevention Homelessness Initiative. The program is interested in partnering with the Park Commission as they have with many other agencies. Ms. Fabela was hired on to focus on the homelessness initiative. Christina Kenney, Program Director for the Empowerment Center, a part of Turning Point Community Programs, now on Needham in Modesto, is also a partner of the homelessness initiative. She is present to share her knowledge on the subject.

2. The homelessness initiative began from a realization of the need to assess and tackle critical issues at the root of the problem, potentially alleviating the ongoing issues various public service agencies are facing. The initiative is focused on maximizing resources through outreach and partnerships. The Stewardship Council identified four core areas critical to improving life in the community. The four core areas will be implemented in phases. The first phase is in progress, aiming at reducing homelessness.

The four core areas identified:

- Reduce homelessness
- Strengthen families
- Investment in children and youth
- Reduce re-entry into the criminal justice system
- 3. Through a homeless population study, the majority were found to be around Modesto. Statistics were collected and not limited to the following: 10% of the homeless population were children, one of the oldest was 83 years of age, 11% had served in the military, others had a physical disability, psychiatric or substance abuse related issue, and list goes on. The study found that others could be just one step away from becoming homeless. Many lack the support system for human services. The Gospel Mission reported denying thirty families from their homeless shelters due to its limited capacity during the summer.

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4.	Barriers and gaps were identified as to which areas will need work; such as, educating the homeless population of available services they may not be aware of, helping the public understand how to tap into resources available to them, and how to navigate through the system efficiently. A question was raised as to how the out-skirted areas of Modesto could be addressed. A multi-sector engagement team will be dispatched to various locations including parks to engage with those who are experiencing homelessness. Often, many agencies are already providing outreach work. The initiative will be generating outreach engagement on a full- time basis. Partnering with existing outreach team can help extend services in more areas. Part of the outreach team includes <i>heroes</i> who have in the past experienced homelessness themselves. Their ability to provide trust in their engagements has been a crucial tool to the success of the initiative.	Veronica Plaugher
5.	For the first time, the partnership is to allow for various agencies to work collaboratively together with a common goal and strategy in mind, minimizing the effort and frustration of the customer, and providing a smooth transition of services throughout the county. Going forward will include a coordinated housing plan that will work for the majority. One strategy was to build on the current housing inventory and establish operation details of how the system will work from beginning to the end.	
6.	Additional efforts will include a one-stop shop access center and a low barrier shelter. The one-stop access center will have available the various services a homeless person can benefit from all in one place. The only two existing low barrier shelters in Modesto at this time are the Modesto Gospel Mission and the Salvation Army.

Licensed non-profit organizations usually have regulations based on their grant funding requirements. A concern/suggestion was brought up about whether these services can be located in areas away from heavy traffic and away from areas with high chances for vandalism or burglary.	Ed Persike
8.	Aligning efforts to ensure there are no gaps will require partnering with agencies that provide the specialized services. Having the dialogue on the issues and services available is an effective short-term and simple start. Time and further research would be required to account for non-citizen services or other statistics.
