ACTIONS & REPORTER D. **STAFF HIGHLIGHTS** June/July 2022 Modesto Reservoir: · Staff continues to do routine maintenance on the campgrounds and bathrooms. Modesto Reservoir is busy with camping and day use. • 4th of July was busy, the campgrounds were fully booked, day use was heavy on Saturday and Sunday. No major issues were reported over the Holiday weekend. The park had to be shut down to all incoming traffic on Saturday July 2nd for a few hours due to heavy use. Modesto Reservoir did well repair work on Well #2, we installed a new Variable Frequency Device at the pump station. Modesto Reservoir now hosts a paddle board vendor. Archery Range: Yahi Bowmen

• The Archery club members continued to mow and maintain the archery range

- The facility is routinely maintained, bathrooms cleaned, and lawns mowed.
- We completed all the electrical repairs and installed new LED lights and repainted the bathroom.

Lagrange OHV:

- Trail work, erosion control, fencing and facility cleanup are done routinely.
- Landscape will begin soon to add some plants and new trees to our upper camping area as part of our development project.
- The park is open for Day use and camping.

• Lagrange OHV now accepts online reservations for our developed sites on the upper camping area. 15 campsites are available to be reserved include potable water, fire pit/BBQ, table and concrete RV pad.
