- Visitation for August was similar to 2021.
- The no body to water contact begins September 6th.
- Thirteen out of sixteen duck blinds pinned spots for the upcoming duck season.
- Restroom cleaning and garbage pick-up is still the order of the day, but after the Labor Day weekend repair work will begin for all the minor damage that was not able to be addressed during the season.
- After the season ends on Labor Day, Ray McCabe will continue taking inventory of all the trees and various amenities in the park with the tree plotter app.

Modesto Reservoir

- Modesto Reservoir is busy with camping and day use.
- Several boating accidents were reported due to boats hitting sand bars, only minor injuries were reported.

Archery Range: Yahi Bowmen

- The archery club members continued to mow and maintain the archery range and targets. Yahi's had a cleanup day at the archery on Aug 22, 2022. They accomplished some major clean up and did some irrigation repairs.
- The archery range continues to be open to the public.
- The Yahi Bowmen hosts 3D shoots every Saturday through the summer.


Kiwanis Youth Camp

- The facility is routinely maintained, bathrooms cleaned, lawns mowed.
- We completed all the electrical repairs and installed new LED lights and repainted the bathroom.

La Grange OHV

- Trail work, erosion control, fencing and facility cleanup are done routinely.
- Landscape project was finished. We planted 200 1 gallon no mow plants, installed drip irrigation system to support the plants and also added 5 20 gallon California oak trees to the upper camp grounds.
- The park is open for day use and camping.
- Lagrange OHV now accepts online reservations for our developed sites on the upper camping area. 15 campsites are available to be reserved include potable water, Fire pit/BBQ, table and concrete RV pad.

- Both fishing access are maintained and cleaned on a regular basis.
- Basso continues to stay busy
- TFA is currently only open for walk-in recreation as the state has close down Turlock Lake as they find a new vendor.

La Grange Park

- The park and restroom are cleaned and maintained regularly.
- Regularly maintain lawns and trees at the old school house.

Community Parks

- **Fairview Park** Basketball court solar lighting project at this location is underway. The lights have been purchased. Footings and poles to which the lights will be affixed will be installed within the next month.
- **Riverdale Park and Fishing Access** Parks continues to work on securing the boat launch gate. Transients are using the gate to access land behind the old transfer station. Bids for custom fabrication are being obtained. We continue to call code enforcement for various trucks and

trailers that park and begin living along the front of the park. Park's staff get questioned/threatened when taking pictures of said vehicles.

- Mono Park –Transients continue to occupy Mono Park off and on as they are forced off surrounding properties in the area owed by Gallo or others. When this happens, they start to enter our park and are very agitated and threatening. Our staff will only stay and maintain this park as they feel safe. If at any time they do not feel safe they have been instructed to leave, whether their work is completed or not.
- **Oregon Park** A single transient person has begun to occupy this park and, in a short time, has accumulated a mass of "personal items" We will work with the Sheriff's Dept. and other agencies to provide this person services, but eventually remove this person from the park. This work is conducted as staff time allows.
- **Broadway/Salida Park** Basketball court solar lighting project at this location is underway. The lights have been purchased. Footings and poles to which the lights will be affixed will be installed within the next month.
- **Burbank Park** Hazard tree work and some tree removals were performed at this location in June.
- **Parklawn Park** Parks has abated the graffiti to the best of their abilities and has spent near \$20,000 in the last few months through contractors to make electrical, plumbing and building repairs at this location.
- **Regional Water Safety Center in Empire –** PAL's swim program has closed for the season.
- Proposed New Developments
 - Hoffman Ranch Is a new proposed residential subdivision in Denair
 - Keyes South will be a sub account within CSA 26 Currently under construction.
 - Orange Grove Estates in Keyes is a new proposed Development
 - Fairway 7 Estates Currently under construction.
 - The Enclave (Villas at Del Rio)
 - Issaco Estates- in Denair is a new proposed development
- Staffing
 - CP/CC is currently down:
 - 5 (five) Full Time Park Aide positions that are vacant are in the process of being filled and should have most if not all starting on 9/12/22.
 - Many staff members out in August for various reasons.
 - CP/CC was down 5-12+ positions every single day.
