## MINUTES

- I. Meeting called to order by Ryan Leupp at 3:35 pm prior to quorum. Commissioner Leslie Beggs present for meeting. Jeremiah Williams arrived after the meeting was adjourned.
- II. Commission Business
  - Previous Minutes No quorum of members was achieved at the meeting so the minutes for August 16, 2017 will be held over to February 21, 2018.
  - Correspondence Commissioner Sofia Schultz has resigned from her position. Commissioner Jon Rodriguez will also not be returning. We will be looking for individuals to fill those vacancies for the upcoming year.
- III. EEO Training
  - Effective Communication Last session was held on August 30th and 30 employees attended. Next session is scheduled for February 15, 2018.
  - Preventing Sexual Harassment (non-mandatory training) Last session was held on August 24th and 11 employees attended. Next session is scheduled for January 18, 2018.
  - Mandatory Sexual Harassment 182 employees have completed online training since last meeting. A class will be held on March 15, 2018.
  - Ethics Scheduled for Spring 2018.
  - Disability Management Training 27 employees attended the session on October 25, 2017. The next session is scheduled for January 30, 2018.

- V. Community Outreach
  - Report Out
    - Ryan was proud to announce that the CEO office is almost done staffing the Focus on Prevention Team. This team will be able to help our community in several ways and everyone is very excited for them to start working at full steam.
- VI. Non-Standing Items
  - Jon Rodriguez is not present, so there will be no recognition speech. There is a certificate that will be mailed to him at a later date.

- CEO office is happy to announce that we are on track with work for the Recruitment and Employee Development Centers. We are working with Final Cut media to create new materials that will help us retract new talent. This effort will make County employment opportunities more accessible to the community.
- A handout with important 2018 law changes was handed out and reviewed by the group.
- The 2018 EEO / Nondiscrimination Statement has been updated and will be presented to the board in January. There were no changes made. The statement was read aloud to the group.
- Ryan presented a short demo of Lynda.com to the group and announced that it will be available to employees in February 2018. This new tool will be available to employees at all times and will be a great addition to our training efforts. He also mentioned that he and Arielle will be available and happy to go out to departments to help facilitate trainings for the program.

  - County EEO Officer Ryan announced that at the EEO Award Ceremony in October, the Ag Commissioner and Department of Environmental Resources were the 2017 winners of the Dionocio Cruz Award.   - Departmental EEO Officers Workforce Development Officer shared that they were recently monitored by the state for their EEO procedures and ADA compliance. They are waiting to hear back with their summary and will follow up with those findings.
