Objectives

- Engage homeless individuals & families living on the street.
- Provide housing for homeless individuals & families.
- Help operate & provide essential services in emergency shelters for homeless individuals & families.
- Prevent individuals & families from becoming homeless.

Grant Technical Assistance Workshop HEAP Program



- To provide immediate emergency assistance to people experiencing homelessness.
- Eligible uses include, but are not limited to,
 - Homelessness prevention activities,
 - Criminal justice diversion programs for homeless individuals with mental health needs,
 - Establishing or expanding services meeting the needs of homeless youth or youth at risk of homelessness,
 - Emergency aid
- The parameters of the program are intentionally broad to allow local communities to be creative and craft programs that meet the specific needs they have identified.

- Housing Relocation and Stabilization Activities

- Rental and Utility Deposits & Arrears
- Housing Search and Placement
- Mediation, Legal Services & Credit Repair



Grant Technical Assistance Workshop Other Program Requirements

- Required participation in HMIS and Coordinated Entry System Specific to Rental Assistance Activities:
- Termination Procedures
- Case Management
- Habitability Standards —Inspection Required
- FMR -twice the amount of the HUD limits (CESH only)
- Rental agreement for property manager/landlord
- Rental agreement or lease in client's name
- Landlord/property owner agreement with agency

GRANT APPLICATION GUIDELINES



Grant Technical Assistance Workshop Application Submission Limits

California Emergency Solutions and Housing Grant (CESH)

- Limit is two (2) grant applications per agency
- Maximum \$400,000 per application

Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP)

- No Limit on number of grant applications
- No Maximum per application





- * **Agency:** Applicant agencies must be a public, private non-profit agency or governmental agency.
- Faith based Agencies: Faith based agencies are eligible to apply but programs may not be specifically religious in content.
- Active Governing Body: Governance of the agency should be vested in a responsible and active board, which meets at least yearly.

CESH Performance Measures

- The number of homeless persons served.
- The number of unsheltered homeless persons served.
- The average length of time spent as homeless before entry into the program or project.
- The number of homeless persons exiting the program or project to permanent housing.
- The number of persons that return to homelessness after exiting the program or project.

Grant Technical Assistance Workshop



Funded Agencies

- Must attend a mandatory Pre-award training workshop which will cover requests for funds, client eligibility, data collection and reporting requirements
- Awarded applicants are required to attend the local monthly CoC meeting and the monthly HMIS sub-committee.
- Awarded applicants must participate in the development and data entry into CES process.
- Awarded applicants are required to enter data in HMIS.

- October 14, 2019 Grant Technical Workshop Release of CESH NOFA
- November 13, 2019 CESH Grant Applications Due
- December 2019 Grant Review Panel Interviews
- December 2019 Scoring Results to Applicants
- January 2020 Award Recommendations to the CoC and BOS
- January 2020 County Planning awards CESH and HEAP sub-recipient agreements
