Wow, it's been busy times in the Transit Division! We have great news on two fronts. **The StaRT bus system was part of a study of the Modesto metropolitan area done by the Brookings Institute's Metropolitan Policy Program. The first of its kind study ranked the Modesto metropolitan area 10th out of 100 metropolitan areas in the United States for effectively connecting people with their jobs!** The transit study reviewed the services of the County's Stanislaus Regional Transit (StaRT) and the City of Modesto's Modesto Area Express (MAX) in compiling the rankings for the Modesto metropolitan area.



Because public transit is such a critical part of the economic and social fabric in metropolitan areas, the high ranking for the Modesto metropolitan area shows the importance the two transit systems play in the lives of Stanislaus County residents. The study showed 90% of the people in the Modesto metropolitan area lived near a transit stop as compared to a 100 metropolitan area average of 69%. The Study can be accessed at:

The second good news is the **Easy Rider** Trip Planner is alive! After much technical fun and games, **Easy Rider** is now working on all of the County's Transit Operators' websites. We broke our record of 228 consecutive accident free days on February 8th 2011. We have been making and breaking a new record every day ever since! In the fiscal year 2010-2011, we distributed \$8,250 in "Bingo" gift cards. That translates into 330 "Bingo's" and does not include the "Blackout" game which total cost was \$450. The absence of accidents and injuries has saved the County hundreds of thousands of dollars.

On June 26 2011, we hit the "One Year" milestone. We did have a few near misses, but addressed those issues immediately and put corrective measures in place to avoid repeat incidents. Several conditions were brought to our attention and addressed immediately before a near miss could even take place.



What's New in the Geographical Information System (GIS) Corner?

We are happy to announce the addition of a new 2010 aerial to our collection on the web base GIS, and we have also added a new way to lookup recorded maps. Now you can search by a map number for survey, parcel, and subdivision maps. The format used to search is a three digit number followed by "RS" for Survey, "PM" for Parcel Map, and "M" for Subdivision (ex: 000RS000, 000PM000, or 000M000). Once you start typing the recorded map number it will display a list of maps you can choose from.

Heron Point Launching Facility

The Heron Point Boat Launching Facility Project (located in Woodward Reservoir Regional Park, Oakdale) was awarded in November 2010 to Ross F. Carroll, Inc. The Department of Public Works has partnered with the Department of Parks and Recreation to provide project management, engineering design, and construction oversight for this project. The estimated cost of this project is \$1,088,855, which is funded by the State of California Boating and Waterways Grant and Stanislaus County Department of Parks and Recreation Public Facility Fee funds.

The project consists of the following: demolition of the existing boat ramp; construction of a new boat-launching ramp; installation of a boarding float; addition of rock slope protection; construction of a new parking area; construction of a new restroom facility; installation of a fish-cleaning station; installation of a sanitary sewer a water distribution system; installation of an electrical and lighting system; drainage system; construction of a kiosk; and landscaping and irrigation.

The improved Heron Point Facility will definitely be attracting many boaters, fisherman, swimmers, and families to Woodward Reservoir. The anticipated date of completion for this project is summer 2011.



A group of Public Works employees, friends and family volunteered their time and money to support the annual American Cancer Society's Relay for Life event.


